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1. Introduction

On the occasion of the World Climate Teach-In Day, a presentation entitled "Climate Change in Cameroon" was made by Mr. Serge Nzali, lecturer in environmental sciences, to students of the School of Wood, Water and Natural Resources (SWWNR), Faculty of Agronomy and Agricultural Sciences, University of Dschang / Ebolowa office, Republic of Cameroon. The presentation took place at the SWWNR on Friday, June 4, between 12:00 and 13:00 p.m.

2. Development

After setting the context of the World Climate Teach-In Day (through the presentation of the website: <http://www.world.climateday.net>) initiated by the Hamburg University of Applied Sciences, Mr. Nzali presented the origins and manifestations of climate change. Then he showed the consequences of these changes on water resources, ecosystems, food security, health and development. Subsequently, international commitments (UN Framework Convention on Climate Change), sub-regional and national to fight this phenomenon have been shown. He finally presented the case of Cameroon by showing the consequences of climate change on disappearing Lake Chad and Cameroon forest issues (Congo Basin) in the fight against this phenomenon. He showed the crucial role that could play the National Observatory for Climate Change, recently established by presidential decree.
